To Whom It May Concern:

My child is not getting the speech and language therapy s/he desperately needs. The current services are not providing the continuous support and therapy we have been constantly promised.

Unfortunately, I can not afford private therapy, and therefore my child can not enjoy the benefits of Release Communication Intervention, a programme, encompassing Speech and Language Therapy, Occupational Exercises, Oral Motor Therapy and Early Intervention, designed to teach us parents the skills we need to enhance our children's communication skills.

I would love to be involved in all aspects of my child's therapy, from their assessment and weekly one hour of therapy to the half hour of homework we would do together each night.

I feel my child will be benefited greatly because of the skills I would learn.

I believe this government should review the Release Programme in great detail, with a view to providing this as a government sponsored service.

The Disability Act 2005 clearly states it is "an act to enable provision to be made for the assessment of health and education needs occasioned to persons with disabilities by their disabilities, to enable ministers of the government to make provision, consistent with the resources available to them and their obligations in relation to their allocation, for services to meet those needs, to provide for the preparation of plans by the appropriate ministers of the government in relation to the provision of certain of those, and certain other services..."

I believe Release can provide the provision of assessments; can provide services to meet those assessment needs; and is a resource which should be made available to the HSE as the current structure is insufficient to meet the needs of my child.

I look forward to seeing Release paid for by this government.
